Favorite 3 Features

- Master View
 - View > Master > Slide Master
 - The ability to change multiple slides at once
- Templates
 - File > Templates > Save
 - The ability to create and save custom templates and backgrounds to build future presentations on.
- Compatibility Features
 - Tools > Options > Load/Save > Microsoft Office
 - NeoOffice on Mac and ability to set defaults = Marriage Saver

Power Features

- Export presentation as PDF
 - File > Export as PDF
 - This is great for sharing a finished version on the web
- Signing presentations with Digital Signatures
 - File > Digital Signatures
 - Verify authenticity of content and source
 - Apparently in some states digitally signed PDF's are accepted in the stead of the hard copy.

Migrating Powerpoints to OpenOffice Impress

- With the OpenOffice.org 2.0 version of Impress most of the conversion is handled automatically for you
 - Open up the powerpoint.ppt in Impress
 - check to see if anything was not converted eg. bullets
 - open up the master slide view fix any layout or bullets
 - check to see if it handles the font often ppt's are created using proprietary fonts.
 - check to see it there where any inserted text blocks or animations that were not handled.
- Your Done It is pretty painless.

Gotchas & Tips

- The only time I have seen gotchas are with converting bullets, proprietary fonts, and complex animations.
 - try to avoid proprietary font's
 - some distros ship will free compatible fonts, other people download and install them if they work with a lot of people using powerpoint
- Really question if you need a particular animation often they distract the audience and detract from the presentation.
